About Berkshire Country Club

The Berkshire Country Club was first established in 1899. It wasn't until 1928 that Willie Park Jr. finished the 18-hole golf course that the membership plays today. Many improvements have been made to the golf course in the past years. The biggest improvement has been the installation of a state-of-the-art irrigation system. This system is comprised of HDPE pipe and utilizes Rain Bird irrigation heads. With the rising costs of city water, Berkshire has taken steps to be more sustainable by drawing water from the adjacent Schuylkill River and storing it in our newly built retention pond. In addition, with the help of our golf course architect, the golf course is being reclaimed to its original design. From reshaping greens to rebuilding tees and mounds, the golf course is once again becoming what Willie Park Jr. intended.
